the primary assessment curriculum and experience pace project is a unique study of the implementation of the national curriculum at primary school level in England. Additionally, it incorporates the modification of the national curriculum following a review by Sir Ron Dearing in 1994 and is informed by a context of uncertainty, critique and constant policy change. All those interested in the impact of the educational changes of the late 1980s and the first half of the 1990s, whether they be academics, teachers, student teachers, school governors or policy makers, will find this book vital reading.
